Resident Spotlight: Peggy R.

Meet Peggy, one of the newest residents in The Lodge with an indomitable spirit and a life of experiences to match. Peggy was born in Sweden and faced her challenges early, at the age of 5. Her mother died in childbirth and her father married a cruel and unsupportive stepmother. As a 12-year-old, Peggy found relief from her stressful home life during the summer months by accepting a home stay on a working farm near the North Sea in the quiet, remote countryside. There she was responsible for milking her own cow and helping with family chores. By the age of 15, she was living in foster homes and finding strength and confidence through sports, especially swimming and gymnastics. The misery of her home life gave rise to an empathetic awareness that drove her to pursue nursing as a way to help others. Peggy is proud to have worked in nursing until her 80th year. At 29, Peggy decided to come to America with a friend to improve her English. Her plan to stay one year was upended when she met and married a special American Black man pursuing his doctorate in Berkeley. Their mixed-race marriage and turbulence of the riotous '60s in Berkeley proved challenging.

(...) The couple dealt with racism and patching up demonstrating students injured in police confrontations was traumatic. Still, life afforded them some bright moments with the birth of their children, two daughters and a son. However, the marriage did not survive. Peggy left with her 10-year-old son and returned to Sweden, enjoying her native country until time to enroll her son in an American high school and reunite with her daughters. With her parenting duties finished, Peggy took adventurous leave and travelled to Calcutta to work with Mother Teresa's Sisters gathering the dead from the streets for merciful and dignified burial. Following several months of compassionate care for the poor, Peggy travelled through India enjoying the culture and even crossed into Tibet. Other adventures in her nursing career took her to Nicaragua for hospital work and caring for mothers delivering their babies at home. Peggy is very proud of overcoming her abusive childhood and rebuilding her confidence through hard work, honesty and her life experiences. Despite the challenges she's confronted over the years, she believes most people are kind, good-hearted, and deserving of care and concern.
